## Our May Tournament--The Speckled Trout Challenge

As you may know several years ago our club's founder, Mike Thompson, challenged the other Mobile County Saltwater Club (The Saltwater Sportsman's Association) to a speckled trout fish-off where the largest 10 specs from both clubs combined would be awarded placement points. These 10 fish are awarded points from 10 for the largest down to 1 point for the 10th largest. The available 55 points are then totaled up by club catching each of the 10 positions and the winning club is then announced.

ACFA has won 4 of the previous 5 challenges and we hope to prevail again in 2003, but we can never rest on our laurels. SSA has many good spec fishermen and we know they'd like nothing better than some sportmen's revenge this year. Mark Sat. May 3rd on your calendar and fish for speckled trout on that day. A traveling trophy and ACFA pride are at stake. Live or artificial bait is allowed; only one fish per member can be turned in; as usual you can launch anywhere; and we need as many members as possible to fish that Sat. Weigh-in Sat. will be at the American Legion on D.I.P. from 3pm to 5pm.

Our award plaques will be presented to every ACFA member who places in the top 10 positions. Additionally, 1 club participation point will be awarded to each member entering a spec and 2 additional club points will be awarded if your fish is one of the top 10 entered. More info at the meeting!

#### Help Feed The Vets

While we've got you thinking about fishing and hopefully competing in some of our ACFA tourneys we want to make an appeal to all of you who might enter fish during any of our competitions. Post 250 (where we weigh-in) puts on regular fishfrys for all the vets living at the Veteran's home over in Biloxi.
