

ACFA Weighmaster Duties

The ACFA Weighmaster shall:

1. Fulfill the duties of this office and represent the Alabama Coastal Fisherman's Association (ACFA) in a manner consistent with the mission statement;
2. Possess a strong working knowledge of all ACFA Tournament, BFC & CPR Rules;
3. Ensure the ACFA Statistician, or designee, is available to enter all weigh-in data on the Official ACFA Weigh Sheets (paper) during Tournament weigh-in activities;
4. Be responsible for keeping the official start/ending time of Weigh-Station in operation:
 - a. Weigh-in times are 1:00 – 3:00 pm (unless otherwise noted);
 - i. Anglers in line (or on premises) to weigh fish by the official closing time of the weigh-station, will be recognized and their catch will be entered;
5. Be responsible for the set-up, proper operation, and secure storage of (in ACFA Trailer):
 - a. The weigh tables;
 - b. The ACFA Digital Scales (and spare batteries);
 - c. ACFA Weigh Sheets;
 - d. Measuring board w/tail 'pinch' tool;
 - e. ACFA Leader Board (and 'feet');
 - f. Chairs.
6. Weigh all fish presented at the ACFA Weigh Station that:
 - a. Meet all eligibility requirements as stated in current ACFA Tournament, BFC & CPR Contest Rules regarding:
 - i. Minimum Weights, Lengths and Slot Limits for all 12 species recognized by the Alabama Coastal Fisherman's Association (ACFA).
7. Ensure the following are cleaned and returned to their proper location (and secured) inside the ACFA Tournament Trailer:
 - a. The weigh table;
 - b. The ACFA Digital Scales (and spare batteries);
 - c. Blank ACFA Weigh Sheets;
 - d. Measuring board w/tail 'pinch' tool;
 - e. ACFA Leader Board (and 'feet');
 - f. Chairs.
8. Address all protests and, if necessary, consult with the highest ranking club officer for final disposition;
 - a. In any case, the decision of the Weighmaster will be considered final.
