'March Madness' Tournament

Our first tournament of the 2008 season was held under much less ideal conditions than we'd hoped for. The influx cold fresh water down the rivers coupled with dense early morning fog and strong south to southwest winds up to 25 knots put a damper on the enthusiasm of many of our potential anglers. No one braved to fish the nearshore rigs as the Gulf waves were in the 6 to 8 feet range, and that was probably a good decision; Many anglers (like myself) had no luck even catching a fish to weigh in and many more struggled to even get their 'participation point'. As always there were a few who solved the fish riddle for the day and put some nice fish in the boat. Donnie Howell placed first in sheepshead and ground mullet with fish he said he "ordinarily wouldn't have bothered to weigh in." It was THAT bad folks! Most anglers chose to fish the Theodore Canal (or other protected waters) and piddled around. But a trio of intrepid anglers (or just plain fish-crazy) had another plan (crazy like a fox;-) Patric Garmeson, Adam Barker and Jim Foster ventured out early in the fog only to run aground on the Dauphin Island Shoals. Not to let a single opportunity get by, the three (never-say-quit) anglers wade fished around their stranded boat while waiting for the rising tide to free them and caught some nice trout and ground mullet in the process. After freeing the boat they proceeded to their choice (secret;-) destination and proceeded to put a 'working over' on the redfish and sheepshead. Still not finished, the group caught even more fish within talking distance to a couple of us in Little Dauphin Bay which seemed to me that day should have been renamed the DEAD SEA! Well I guess some days ya got it, and some you wind up eating the bait;-) At least we were all rewarded at the weighin with some great fellowship and treated to Randy Wiscaver (Bigun's) fine BBQ with beans and coleslaw. That there was worth the early rise!

Our next Tournament: Saturday April 5 is the "Spring Breakout"... Again we will have four species: Speckled Trout, Flounder, Sheepshead, and Ground Mullet. And again the club will be offering plaques to the top three Junior anglers who weigh in fish for each of these categories. In addition we will give plaques (but NO tournament points) to the anglers who bring the top three pompano to scales. Let's hope we have better weather this time around! P.S. you have to come to the meeting to find out what's on the menu ;-)


President's Message

ACFA believes in safety on the water. We have again this year, arranged for representatives of the Coast Guard Auxiliary to speak at the April meeting and provide FREE (voluntary) non-binding safety inspections of our boats during the hours of the weigh-in at our April Tournament. Last year about 20 ACFA boats were inspected, and we'd like to see even more than that this year. All you have to do is after you pull your rig into the parking lot at the weigh in site, and ask one of the USCG Auxiliary members to have your boat inspected. It is non-binding with no follow up or any penalties. Even if you don't fish the tournament, you can come by and get a free inspection (and eat ;-). If your rig passes you will be given a (free) U.S.C.G.A. sticker for display on your boat. NOTE: the presence of an up to date sticker on your boat could preclude a whole lot of hassle should you be checked on the water in the future. ACFA encourages this "boat check-up". And did you know that with a passing certificate you can purchase any regular safety item at participating marine stores and receive a 10% discount on your purchase.
