June Tournament and Membership Family Fish Fry

Our next tourney the "Summer Starter" will be held on Saturday June 7th. We will fish for speckled trout, flounder, white trout, and ground mullet and 12 plaques will be awarded.

Weigh-in will be from 3-5pm at the American Legion Post 250 on D.I.P. (on west side of hiway next to the Dollar Store) approx. 1 block south of Bayley's Restaurant and Greer's Food Tiger. ACFA members will park, weigh-in, and eat at rear of the main post building. Our fish-fry will utilize the large, covered screen porch area with picnic tables just like last year.

We fed approximately 100 folks last year and we expect to do at least that well again in 2003. Everyone in the club is invited, so plan to attend even if you don't fish in the tourney. We'll be looking for you, your wife, and all the kids! Charlie Dowdle and his crew plan to make fried fish and all the trimmings ready by 4pm and, if you can, we ask that you purchase some of your cold beverages from post 250 since these folks have welcomed us with open arms and great hospitality.

As the fish come in during the weigh-in we'll have a volunteer fish cleaning crew to produce our main dish so don't throw anything edible away on Saturday. And please consider contributing some cleaned, frozen fish to this undertaking beforehand so that we'll have at least some fish ready to fry early-on on Sat. to that end Charlie will accept any <u>frozen</u> fish, that you may care to donate, at the meeting on Thurs. nite. Any quantity of any species will be appreciated. Don't forget to remember!

Consider This

It's June again. Probably the last big slug of high river water has just passed so the Mobile, Tensaw, and Blakeley Rivers should now start to clear up to "fishable". The fish have remained at Choctaw Pass. Flounders have been caught off the Fairhope Pier for almost a month. Fish are biting along the eastern shore and Zundels, Klondike, and Fish River reefs are producing limits. Shell bank reef has been productive for more than 3 weeks now. The new hard bottoms are going to be placed around the MaryAnn rig and several others. Blackfishing and "schooling-fish-under-the-birds" are about to begin. Shrimp are once again plentiful in most of our waters. It's flounder time at Dog River, Fowl River, and they've been biting at the canal for several weeks. The Hollinger's Island reef and Gaillard Is. have been producing good fish for more than a month. Denton reef will now be producing with regularity as should Middle Bay Light, the High Markers, and almost every rig in the lower bay. White trout will bite along the main ship channel and the Theodore Channel. Specs have been at the Shoals and along Dauphin Island since late April and there are really some bigger fish this year. Portersville Bay and Coffee Is. are once again in full swing with both whites and specs available over the oyster beds, and the Blue Rig has produced since early in May.

The winds have finally started to subside a bit and hurricane season isn't upon us yet. If you haven't stopped to think about all this please do so now. We believe you'll agree with us that this <u>is</u> the prime part of our fishing year. We hope that each of you will find a little time to get out on the water and enjoy the experience. This is truly a great time to be an inshore fisherman in Alabama! It just doesn't get much better than this!
